Weekend Re-Cap for February 8-9, 2013

CHARGERS VOLLEYBALL AT HOME

The Chargers produced another thrilling weekend of hard-hitting volleyball action as the squads hosted the Capilano University Blues in their final home weekend of league play. There was no easy way around this weekend's double-header as both teams fought it out to four on Friday before taking their matches all the way to five on Saturday.

In women's action, the Chargers split their matches against the Blues with a 3-1 loss on Friday (25-20, 25-22, 21-25, 25-20) and a terrific five-set turn-around victory on Saturday (25-16, 25-22, 24-26, 14-25, 15-12). Third-year leftside Hilary Graham generated an outstanding weekend total of 41 points (36 kills, 2 blocks, 3 aces) and 21 digs. Top performances on defense in Saturday's match were made by second-year Kelsey Johnson who amassed 20 digs and third-year Mariah Holmstrom who posted 16. At 9-13, Camosun holds on to 4th place in the PACWEST standings.

On the men's side, the weekend presented fans with some of the best volleyball ever played under PISE's gymnasium roof as the two teams battled through extensive rallies, calculated kills and rock-solid blocking. While Camosun defeated the Blues in four on Friday (25-18, 20-25, 25-23, 25-17), the home team was forced to close-out the weekend with a disappointing five-set fall-out that ended in favor of Capilano (25-19, 25-23, 18-25, 19-25, 18-16). Third-year leftside Jeremy Finn led the Chargers on both days with a total of 42 points (30 kills, 10 blocks, 2 aces) and 32 digs. Fifth-year veteran Andy Inglis made another solid performance contributing 32 points (28 kills, 3 blocks, 1 ace) and 17 digs over the weekend. With only two matches remaining in the regular season, the Chargers are 14-8 and in 3rd place.

CHARGERS BASKETBALL ROAD RESULTS

The Chargers women's basketball team dropped both their games this weekend falling to the PACWEST's #1 Capilano Blues 60-48 on Friday and suffering a disappointing loss in overtime on Saturday against Quest 67-62. The squad is now 7-12 and tied with Langara for 6th spot.

The men were also defeated in both weekend contests going down 68-60 against Capilano and 88-77 to Quest. The Chargers move to 7-12 and are tied for 5th place with Capilano.
