### **Weekend Re-Cap for January 25-26, 2013**

#### **CHARGERS VOLLEYBALL AT HOME**

The Chargers volleyball teams produced a thrilling weekend of action amidst two wins and two losses against the visiting UFV Cascades, with the women falling to the CCAA's top ranked team in both Friday and Saturday's contests and the men collecting a sweep.

While the women went down in three to Fraser Valley on Friday (25-16, 26-24, 25-13), the team demonstrated their credibility as one of the conference's key contenders in Saturday's exciting two-hour battle which went all the way to five with Camosun leaping to a two-set lead before the nation's #1 answered back taking the next three (20-25, 21-25, 25-17, 25-17, 20-18). Second-year middle Morgan Marshall led Camosun on Friday with 10 kills and 3 blocks. On Saturday, Marshall and teammate Hilary Graham (Year 3 leftside) contributed 17 points apiece. Marshall posted 1 ace, 11 kills and 5 stuff blocks while Graham had 2 aces, 14 kills and 1 stuff block. The Chargers are 7-11 and maintain 4<sup>th</sup> place in the PACWEST standings with three weekends of competition remaining in the season.

The Chargers men were focused and powerful in Friday's match against Fraser Valley, taking less than 70 minutes to blast past their opponents in straight sets (25-17, 25-20, 25-15). Saturday's clash was a four-set see-saw battle and although the match could have gone either way, the home team prevailed in the final stretches of the last three sets, edging out their opponents to capture their 11<sup>th</sup> win of the season (21-25, 25-22, 25-23, 25-22). With 18 matches in the books and six to go, the Chargers men are tied for third as they enter the push for the PACWEST playoffs. Third-year leftside Jeremy Finn (Westbank, BC) led Camosun to victory on Friday with 14 points (4 aces, 9 kills, 1 block). Fifth-year rightside Andrew Inglis led Camosun to Saturday's win scoring 20 points with 4 aces, 15 kills and 1 block. Jeremy Finn made another impressive performance with 15 points (13 kills and 2 blocks) and 16 digs.

#### **CHARGERS BASKETBALL ON THE ROAD**

The Chargers women split their games this weekend losing to Kwantlen (53-48) on Friday before virtually running away with their game versus CBC on Saturday, 81-29. At 6-9, the Chargers hold on to 6<sup>th</sup> place with six games remaining. The Chargers men swept their weekend games with a 90-76 win against Kwantlen and a 77-76 nail-biter against the Bearcats. The back-to-wins advance Camosun to a 3<sup>rd</sup> place tie with a record of 7-8.
